Purpose of Meeting: Feedback on Steering Committee meeting, planning for next couple of Steering Committee meetings.

I. Feedback from 9.28 Steering Committee:

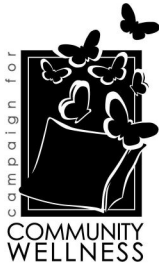
The group discussed general feedback on the Steering Committee meeting held on Sept. 28. Comments are listed below:

- Consumers and some “non prevention” focused CBO’s gave very supportive comments about the meeting.
 - They found it very interesting and informative
- Some of the CBO’s expressed that they did not feel heard during this process
- Lynne’s presentation was great and informative
- The collaborative exercise could have been longer and less rushed
 - Also, it was suggested that the exercise could have been broader in that we just identify needs

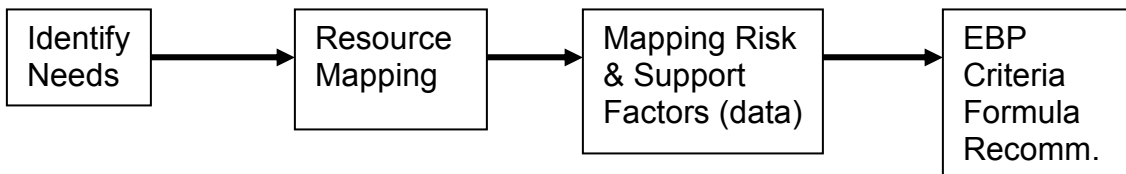
II. Moving forward with PEI Planning process

A. The group discussed getting additional feedback on needs from various sectors of Placer County. After some discussion, it was determined that:

- Streamline would develop an agenda and coordinate the input for the community input sessions. The elements are to include:
 - i. Overview of Prevention/Intervention (a reduced version of Lynne’s presentation)
 - ii. Input session to identify: needs, risk factors and supports (assets)
- It was suggested that the 5 FRC’s in Placer County would be a good meeting place for this feedback
 - i. Streamline to coordinate with Kings Beach FRC (w/CCTT) and CAPC
- Additionally, it was suggested that the SAMHSA identified groups may wish to conduct specific community needs discussions:
 - i. Anno Nakai to lead an input session for the Native American Council
 - ii. Latino Leadership Council conduct a similar exercise
 - iii. Youth Advisory Council



B. The group then discussed needing an overall framework for decision making and that we needed to put forth to the Steering Committee a recommended set of criteria/formula to follow. In general the framework will flow per the diagram below:



We will meet to discuss this more fully on 10/24 at 10am.

C. Finally it was mentioned that it would be useful for Lynne to reiterate to the group the definition of prevention and how this is different from traditional mental health services. Lynne will not be available for the next October meeting, so this will be put on the November agenda.

III. Planning / Brainstorming next October meeting

It was discussed that because Lynne will not be able to meet for the October meeting, that we use this meeting to provide updates on the broader Campaign issues, specifically in the areas of:

- Cultural competency (general update for context setting)
 - Latino Leadership Community Group update
 - Native American Community Group update

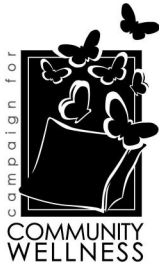
It was then mentioned that the Steering Committee will expect to have some element of prevention/intervention at this meeting. So the idea presented was to begin asset mapping by having each organization/person:

- Present an overview of their agency(or self) and place it on the continuum of service (prevention/intervention/core services).
- Identify the most significant unmet need that their organization/or self faces and place this along the continuum.

Streamline will formalize this agenda and get to Michele Zavoras to route to the Steering committee so that they can prepare for the exercise above.
